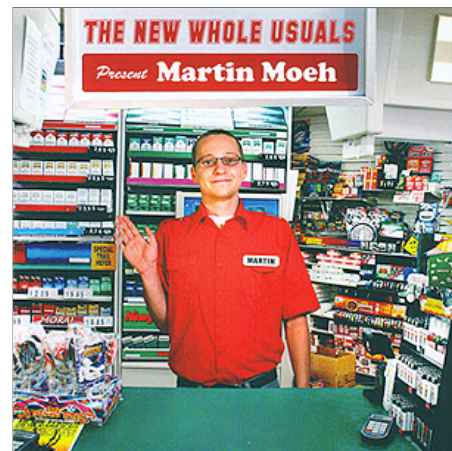
Martin Moeh thinks he's a mix tape.
